Congratulations to Ken Schuch, Brian Sheridan and Eileen Martin Ferguson, Agnieszka Burkevic Wieremczuk and James Weissensel for competing in Bill Thom's Winter Cross Country Challenge races Sunday in Caldwell Woods. Cold, ice conditions didn't stop these Riis Park Striders. Ken was the top finisher in the 6 hr race covering 29.462 miles, edging out Brian who ran 29.212 miles in that time. The two combined to take the team title. Twelve runners competed in that race. Eileen ran the 5k along with 35 other runners and was the only finisher in her age group. James Weissensel took the 15K championship in 1:03:37 and Agnieszka Burkevic Wieremczuk finished 3rd in her age group with a time of 1:29:02. Twenty four runners finished the 15k.
