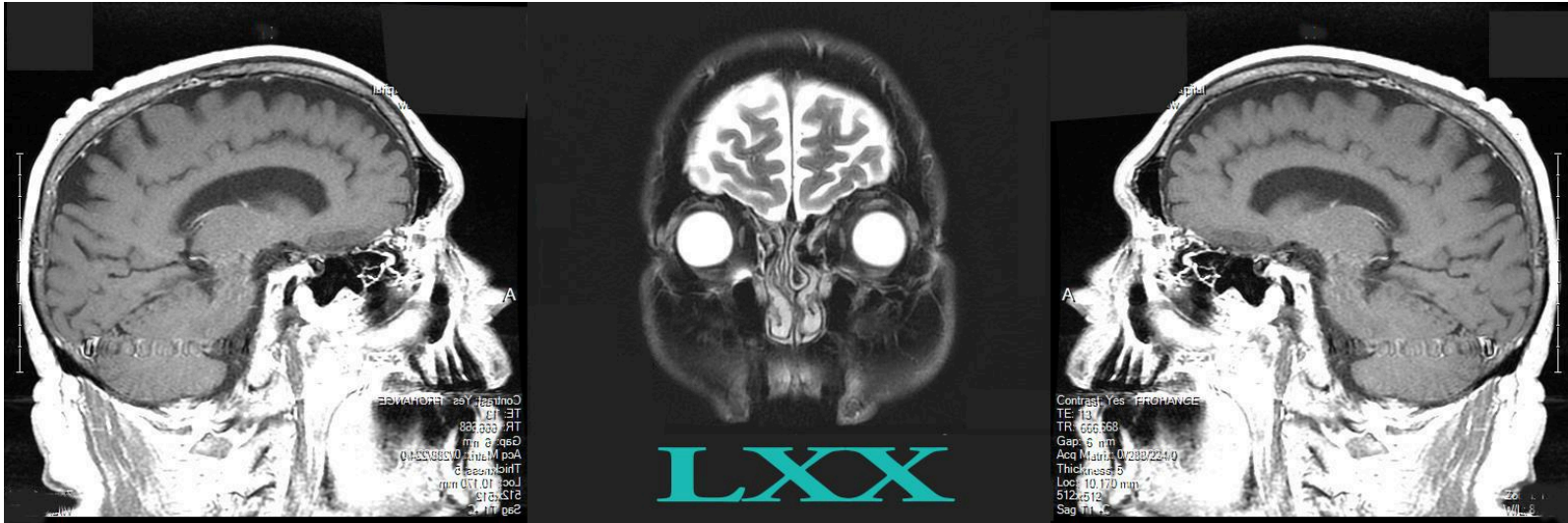

1752 - He experimented by flying a kite during a thunderstorm. The result was a little spark that showed the relationship between lightning and electricity.

1844 - He was granted a patent for the process that strengthens rubber. .

1898 - The U.S. House of Representatives approved the annexation of this area.

1920 - 52nd Belmont: Clarence Kummer aboard this horse wins by massive 20 lengths in world record 2:14.2

1928 - New York Yankees future Baseball Hall of Famer collects 14 total bases with 2 triples and 2 home runs in a 15-7 win over Chicago White Sox

1938 - This Reds pitched his second straight no-hitter.

1950 - Following his retirement announcement after 49 years he is named Honorary Manager of the MLB All-Star Game

1957 - He plays in his 823rd game (new NL consecutive-game streak)

1982 - In the capital city of Stanley, this war ended as these troops surrendered to the British.
