**1906** - He left for Panama to see the progress on the new canal. It was the first foreign trip by a U.S. president.

**1950** - After being a White Sox since 1930 the team released him.

**1953**- Supreme Court rules this organization exempt from anti-trust laws

**1965** - This Giant is named NL MVP

**1982** - He wins AL MVP unanimously

**1984** - He TKOs Bonecrusher Smith in 12 for heavyweight boxing title

**1985** - At age 22, becomes the youngest ever World Chess Champion, with a 13-11 win over fellow countryman Anatoly Karpove

**1996** - He upsets Mike Tyson in 11th-round knockout in Las Vegas to regain WBA heavyweight boxing title; second boxer, after Muhammad Ali, to win a heavyweight title 3 times
